The Hoodlebug Trail is a 10 mile recreation and commuter trail running from Black Lick to Indiana and is open year-round for non-motorized activities, including bicycling, hiking, and cross-country skiing. It is also part of a large network of trails in western Pennsylvania known as the Trans Allegheny Trails network. The trail follows the abandoned Indiana Branch of the Pennsylvania Railroad between the Homer City area and Indiana, which was built in the 1850's. 'Hoodlebug' was the local nickname for the self-propelled passenger coach that ran on the line until 1940.
